Climbing wall

The climbing wall provides an alternative route to the 1.17m platform. The button climbing holds are user-friendly supports for children's hands and feet as they make their way up and across the climbing wall. The anti-slip surface of the climbing wall provides additional grip. Different coloured climbing holds give a decorative appeal, as well as allowing other users to be able to offer advice as to the best hold on which to place a hand or foot in order to advance upwards. Accompanying adults can help the users to improve their technique by advising them to push with their legs, whilst using their hands to direct their bodies across the wall surface.

sliding





Slide

The slide enables users to experience sliding down to the ground from platforms located at a height of 1.17m. A protective bar at the top of the slide prevents any accidental falls, as well as providing a support for users as they install themselves on the slide bed. The relatively steep gradient at the start of the slide provides exhilarating sensations, before slowing down users as they come towards the safer surfacing.
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The clock is attached to the seat-ledge game located under the slide. This configuration optimises play space. Children can turn the disc inside and adjust the hands of the clock on the outside. They must then read or tell the time on the dial. The clock is an interactive, tactile learning play feature.

Maze panel

This panel is a touch and visual game activity for observation and thinking. The child must find the food that will end up in the basket. He/she can find it by following the paths of the maze visually or by touching the panel.

getting across

Stairway


The intermediate stairway provides an inclined access from the 60cm platform to the 1.17m platform. The stairway is wide enough to allow users to pass, whilst being narrow enough to provide reassurance for younger users climbing up for the first time. The metal steps are equipped with an anti-slip, textured finish providing grip even in wet conditions. The stairway is decorated with two play activities: a game involving the manipulation of the dog's ear, and a game where the child must show or hide the letter in the letter box. These features optimise the play space and develop children's imagination.





Intermediate staircase

The intermediate stairway provides an inclined access from the 60cm platform to the 1.17m platform. The stairway is wide enough to allow users to pass, whilst being narrow enough to provide reassurance for younger users climbing up for the first time. The metal steps are equipped with an anti-slip, textured finish providing grip even in wet conditions. The stairway is decorated with two play activities: the windows feature which enables users to see without being seen and a lottery game which is played by turning the dog's ball.





Themed square platform

This compact platform (60cm x 60cm) located at only 60cm above the ground provides reassurance for the youngest users. Parents can hold the hand of children using play equipment for the first time. The solid materials used in the construction of the platform ? non-slip HPL and stainless steel ? ensure stability and long term durability.



Themed tower

This compact, rectangular platform $(0.90 \times 0.60m)$ is a place for stopping, resting and combining the various play activities. The compact roof and under roof add to the city theme, with a little cat strolling on top. They also provide protection from rain and sun. The platform is an anti-slip compact panel.
